



2023 SPRING CONCERT PERFORMANCE AGREEMENT VOICE DEPARTMENT

The Franklin School for the Performing Arts will present Spring Concert 2023 on Saturday, May 20 at 4:00 p.m. & 7:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 21 at 1:00 p.m. & 4:00 p.m. at Franklin High School. **This performance agreement contains important information and we require a parent's signature from each performer to insure that you understand the Spring Concert format and procedures.**

PERFORMING IN SPRING CONCERT IS OPTIONAL AT FSPA. We do encourage performing as part of a student's arts education; we hope to provide a positive, motivating, and FUN opportunity with Spring Concert and an entertaining presentation for our audiences. Our show includes representation from our school's three departments of Music, Dance, and Drama and features some exciting collaborations of the disciplines. In order for us to provide a professional performance setting, please read and understand this memo BEFORE signing the permission slip.

SPRING CONCERT FORMAT

Spring Concert is presented in four, 90 minute performances - Saturday at 4:00 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. and Sunday at 1:00 p.m. & 4:00 p.m. The shows will have no intermission and there will be a FINALE which will include every performer! Participation in the finale is required. All students will remain backstage, supervised, for the duration of each performance. It is unlikely that children enrolled in more than one class will perform with both classes at the same show. It would be impossible for us to schedule this way with the number of performers involved. Advanced dancers MAY be invited to perform a piece in more than one show.

TICKETS

Visit our website, FSPAonline.com to purchase tickets ONLINE. Tickets will continue to be sold in the box office or by phone as well. Reserved seating only. Tickets are not held without payment and are non-refundable. Mastercard, Visa and Discover accepted. Convenience fees apply for online and telephone orders. The performance schedules for the four shows will be posted in April before the box office opens.

REHEARSALS

Music for Spring Concert will be introduced in classes as part of the spring curriculum. Any student not performing (or taking a make-up class) will gain great experience by learning ANY music! Voice Classes will rehearse on stage immediately prior to their concert. They will NOT have a separate rehearsal.

BACKSTAGE

The help of parent volunteers is appreciated for dress rehearsals and performances. Contact Kim Rezendes at krezendes@fspaonline.com if you would like to be considered. Only supervisors with badges will be allowed backstage during the shows.

DISMISSAL

Parents agree to the FSPA dismissal policy. One parent only will be allowed backstage to pick up a performer. A detailed dismissal policy will be posted on our website prior to the performances.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

Excellent class attendance is mandatory during the preparation time for a performance. A student’s absence affects the teacher’s efforts and makes rehearsal difficult for the entire group. PLEASE call the FSPA office if an absence is absolutely necessary. A student with 3 unexcused absences during Spring Concert preparation time may not be allowed to perform.

COSTUME

All voice class students will wear white (NOT off-white) blouses, polos, button-up shirts or sweaters with black pants or a black skirt, black tights (with skirts) and black socks and shoes. Hair must be pulled back from the face. No jewelry or nail polish. Very light blush and mascara is fine or whatever is required from other classes your child may be performing with that day.

PERMISSION SLIP IS DUE IN THE OFFICE BY April 29.
